What aspects of this course should remain the same?

What aspects of this course need improvement?

1. I think the reading summaries could be more structured. Maybe each week have a list of concepts to grasp from the readings to be filled out and turned in weekly. Kind of like a take home quiz?
2. None.
3. I really enjoyed the guest speakers we had so if you could somehow squeeze maybe one more in it would be pretty cool.
4. Participation counts as 5% for the total grade. I hardly ever spoke, but that doesn't mean I didn't learn just as much. I suggest eliminating that 5% for participation, and replacing it with something else. Maybe for attendance? Our final paper is topic of our choice, but it would have been great for some people to present their research on their topic. One of my professors gave students a choice of either writing a paper or doing a presentation as their final. Maybe this should be implemented in this class since some of the research topics are so interesting!
5. The ONE complaint I have is the fact that her writing assignments are a bit overbearing, especially in relation to the book and movie reviews. She expects five pages written, within like a week, and they should have outside sources related cited inside the paper. Those were a bit much; I got most of what I said written within like three pages, and I don't see why outside sources are so important in papers that are supposed to review a documentary or book, and my grades sometimes suffered for it.

6. Class discussion among students isn't as valuable as prepared materials. People who are more introverted may seem less prepared than the opinionated or extroverted students who dominate class discussion. Daily reading and summaries can seem overwhelming, but may be necessary. I regret my neglect of these readings because it may hurt my grade and also because it felt disrespectful to the professor who was very agreeable. I was not impressed by "Half the Sky" as a major focus of the latter half of the course, but criticism of materials is always an option in this class.
7. Summaries are tedious. I understand that there needs to be some sort of way to gauge whether students read the material, but there has to be some method outside of pop quizzes and summaries.
8. The critical summaries can be overwhelming, especially when a student has other classes and is not full time- has job, family responsibilities and the like. But they are good and necessary to get the work done. But readings from scanned course book articles were old and poor. That needs to be changed. I had to buy a hard copy of the class text.
9. I don't think it needs any improvements.
10. Discussion really helped me in this class. However, I think we needed more guidance of the professor because sometimes the discussions went everywhere and it was hard for me to focus.
11. The workload was a little much at times. This was the class I did the most work in all semester, without a doubt. Maybe next time, assigning either a final or a research paper instead of both would be helpful.
12. Some topics were not expanded on enough i.e. environmental sustainability, and the course wasn't as economically focused as I thought it would be.
13. The number of reading summaries is a bit overburdening. Also, the fact that there is a research paper due and then a very extensive take home final puts a lot of strain on the students. I would have probably preferred having the research paper due earlier on in the semester, like before Thanksgiving break or so.
14. I believe that a portion dedicated to the impact of government presence in regions would be useful for this course. Relating it to how illegal activities, such as growing drugs or the harboring of terrorist groups occur in low presence areas would provide excellent material that is related to the topic of development, since both can have widespread impact on development. Additionally, it is possible to talk of alternative development efforts by governments in order to discourage the growing of drugs.

16. The way that some of the content is taught, in terms of movies and a book, needs some alteration. The Bottom Billion, Good Fortune, and Half the Sky are all important to the course, as they do a good job at giving a big picture on top of specifics, but the other works that we looked over seemed to be repetitive on what we discussed in class beforehand, and not additive.
17. I'm conflicted about the final. I loved writing it and I liked doing it at home so I could address my notes, but it was very long and hard to find time to complete it outside of assigned class final times being a student with a full-time job. If there could possibly be a way to keep the format but have it take place at an assigned final exam time that would have been preferable.
18. Less usage of movies and films during class. While they get a point across quite well, they don't necessarily explain the theoretical or practical modelling that occurs in each situation.
