Comments to improve course

My only suggestion for improvement is to go over the major class assignments a little more thoroughly before they are due. With several of the assignments, I felt that we hadn't adequately covered the material that was needed to complete the assignment, and there were some concepts that we needed to discuss in the assignment that we hadn't yet gone over in class. For example, for the research design assignment, it would have been helpful to have explored Qualtrics in class. In the multiple regression assignment, we were asked to discuss practical and statistical significance, which I don't recall having covered in class yet (we read the chapter about significance after we submitted this assignment). Aside from this, I thought the class was really excellent. Professor Valente is a fun, enthusiastic professor who is obviously passionate about the material she teaches! I found all of the assignments and readings to be very helpful, and I also enjoyed the in-class group projects.

There are a few things I would change about the design of the course if I were to suggest improvements: a) consistency with posting quizzes. They should go up the same day/time every week. We should also know ahead of time (on the syllabus), which weeks we will be expected to take a quiz. b) Problem Sets and Assignments were good measures of if we knew how to apply the course concepts, however, make the questions more simple + clear. We should not be spending most of our time trying to decipher what the professor is asking/wants our answer to be. We should instead spend most of our time trying to answer the questions, proving our knowledge of the subject matter. I spent too many hours trying to understand the questions. Making them more clear, precise, and not up for so much interpretation will help the professor, too, with less students bombarding the professor for clarity. It will be a win-win for both.
